Code of Conduct for Parents/Carers

A number of factors influence a swimmer's achievement and enjoyment from the sport, but their Parent/Carer undoubtedly has a key role to play. The following details the key behaviours that CASC expect from the Parents/Carers associated with our Club:

All CASC Parents/Carers will strive to follow this framework:

- Parents/Carers should encourage their child to adhere to the Club's Behaviour Agreement.
- Parents/Carers should discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Parents/Carers should encourage their child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Parents/Carers should never force their child to take part in swimming.
- Parents/Carers should set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding good performances of all.
- Parents/Carers should never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Parents/Carers should publicly accept officials' judgements.
- Parents/Carers should use correct and proper language at all times.
- Parents/Carers should develop an open and honest relationship with the coaches.
- Parents/Carers will ensure that Coaches are informed if swimmers are unable to attend training or swim in a competition or have any illness or injuries and medication.
- Parents/Carers will ensure swimmers arrive in good time for training and competitions with the right kit, equipment, food and drink.
- Parents/Carers and Coaches will put the safety and well being of the swimmer above all else at all times.
- Parents/Carers will adhere to the equity requirements of Wavepower, the ASA Child safeguarding policy and procedures
